

MS Graduate Assistantships Available with Focus on QTL Identification in Wheat



WSU plant breeders have achieved international recognition for fundamental and cross-disciplinary research on identifying wheat QTL for agronomically important traits and disease resistance. Recently, QTL have been identified for durable resistance to stripe rust, and markers have been made available for use in marker-assisted selection programs. Recent funding has made it available to continue identifying QTL and molecular markers in wheat for Hessian fly resistance, stripe rust resistance and cold tolerance.

Assistantship Details:

The Department of Crop and Soil Sciences, Washington State University, offers graduate research assistantships to qualified graduate students from recognized colleges and universities. Research assistants conduct experiments under the direction of their advisor. Graduate student appointments are half-time and students on formal appointment receive stipends on an annual basis. Students are expected to work part-time on research during the academic year and full-time during the summer. Appointments are continued for a minimum of two years for M.S. students and three years for Ph.D. students, dependant upon satisfactory performance and the maintenance of a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

Salary Range: \$17,154.00 M.S. (\$1429.50/mo); \$18,204.00 Ph.D (\$1517/mo). The assistantship appointment also includes tuition waivers per our policy outlined at <http://gradsch.wsu.edu>. Resident tuition waivers have an estimated value of \$3,731 per semester; non-resident waivers have an estimated value of \$6,094 per semester. All students on an assistantship are required to pay a residual fee each semester of approximately \$1,000.00. The residual fee pays for Health and Wellness Services, Pullman Transit, the Student Recreation Center, and a small portion of tuition not covered by the assistantship. Also included is a comprehensive health (medical/dental) insurance program with the annual premium paid by the department estimated at \$1,500.
